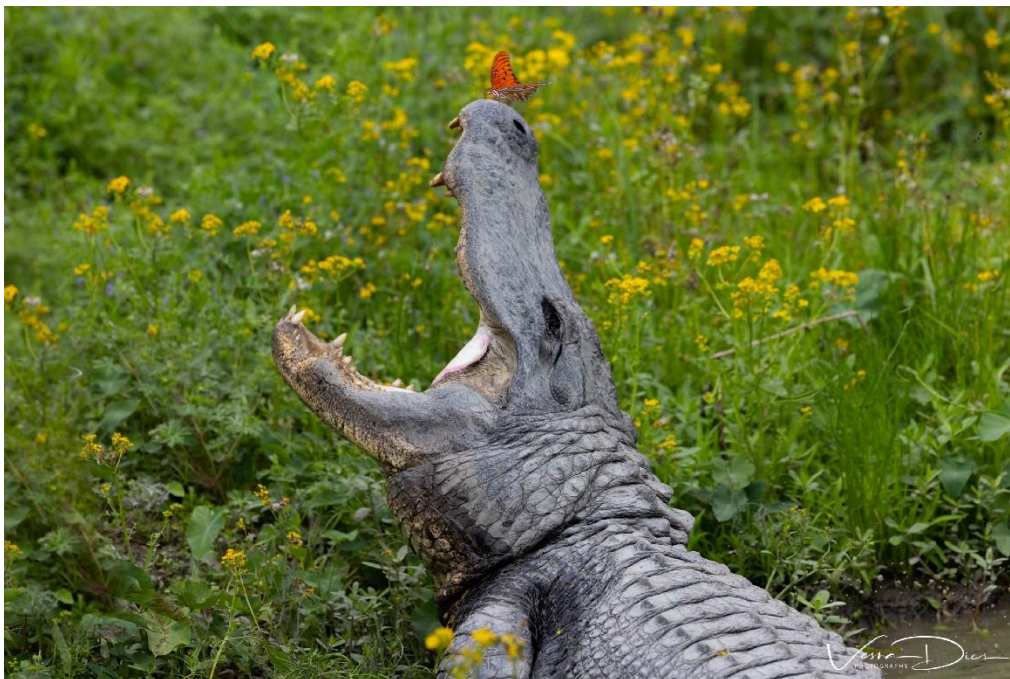

Close out the day by stopping in at the [Coastal Center](#) in Thibodaux. Located on the campus of Nicholls State university, the state-of-the-art research and education facility is dedicated to studying Louisiana's

Coastal environment. It brings together scientists, students and community partners to address the challenges of coastal land loss. Stop in to explore their exhibits, and don't miss the storm surge ruler, where you can see just how high the water rose during past hurricanes.
